## BAKER HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® ALABAMA SOFTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-11 senior shortstop and right-handed pitcher led the Honeybees (50-6-1) to the Class 7A state championship this past season. Sumerlin finished with a .435 batting, including 12 home runs and 68 RBI, along with a 22-1 record and a 1.35 ERA in the circle. A First Team All-State selection and the Coastal Alabama Player of the Year, she slugged 16 doubles, five triples, 30 stolen bases and 71 runs scored.

Sumerlin has maintained a 3.89 GPA in the classroom. A devoted member of her church community, she has volunteered locally on behalf of a nursing home and youth sports programs.

"Sumerlin is a phenomenal athlete," said Brenda Box, head coach at Mary G. Montgomery High. "Her offensive stats speak for themselves, and at shortstop she is extremely quick and has a great arm. She started pitching as a senior and became a powerhouse there too."

Sumerlin has signed a National Letter of Intent to play softball on scholarship at the University of Georgia this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
