## SANFORD HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® MAINE SOFTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (June 4, 2015) — In its 30<sup>th</sup> year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Jen Jones of Sanford High School as its 2014-15 Gatorade Maine Softball Player of the Year. The 5-foot-8 junior right-handed pitcher and outfielder has led the Spartans to a 13-2 record and a berth in the Class A state tournament, scheduled to begin June 9. Jones posted a 13-2 record with a 1.43 ERA and 198 strikeouts in 107 innings through 15 games and has struck out at least 10 batters in every game she has pitched this spring. A First Team All-State selection, she has also batted .470 with 25 RBI and a .720 slugging percentage.

Jones has maintained a 90.5 average in the classroom. She has volunteered locally on behalf of the Nasson Community Center and as a youth soccer and volleyball coach.

"Jen Jones is a great leader of her team on and off the field," said Sanford High head coach Mike Bailey. "Her softball skills speak for themselves through her stats. She also takes five classes a day out of a four-class-per-day schedule by coming in early to school to further her education. She is an all-around great example of a high school student-athlete."

Jones will begin her senior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
