ST. MARY CATHOLIC CENTRAL HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® MICHIGAN SOFTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (June 4, 2015) — In its 30th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Meghan Beaubien of St. Mary Catholic Central High School as its 2014-15 Gatorade Michigan Softball Player of the Year. Beaubien is the first Gatorade Michigan Softball Player of the Year to be chosen from St. Mary Catholic Central High School.

The 5-foot-8 sophomore left-handed pitcher has led the Kestrels (34-4) to the Division 3, Regional 22 semifinals, scheduled for June 6. Beaubien is 24-3 in the circle with a 0.38 ERA and 393 strikeouts in 164.2 innings pitched through 38 games. The 2014 Division 3 First Team All-State selection has allowed just 39 hits and 25 walks, recording nine no-hitters, including five perfect games. At the plate, she is batting .430 with three home runs, 29 RBI and a .640 slugging percentage.

Beaubien has maintained a weighted 4.73 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally as a youth tutor and as a pitching instructor, and she has donated her time to multiple community-service initiatives on behalf of her school's Interact Club.

"Meghan Beaubien is without a doubt the success of SMCC softball this year," said Heather Holshoe, head coach of Huron High. "As the season goes on, she has gotten stronger and stronger."

Beaubien has made a verbal commitment to play softball on an athletic scholarship at the University of Michigan beginning in the fall of 2017.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
