NIAGARA FALLS HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® NEW YORK SOFTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-5 senior shortstop led the Wolverines to a 12-3 record and the sectional tournament this past season. Polk produced a .532 batting average with 12 RBI and 16 runs scored. A two-time All-State honoree and the two-time Niagara Frontier Player of the Year, she is rated as the nation's No. 28 player in the Class of 2015 by Full Count Softball.

Polk has maintained an A average in the classroom. A devoted member of her church choir and the school's Increase the Peace club, she has volunteered locally on behalf of Community Missions of Niagara Frontier, Inc.

"Polk excels at everything she does," said Julie Kwoka, head coach at Lockport High. "She can do anything at the plate: bunt, slap, hit for power, you name it. She doesn't miss much in the field, and her speed and instinct on the bases are exceptional. She's one of the top players I have coached against over the 27 years that I've been coaching softball."

Polk has signed a National Letter of Intent to play softball on scholarship at Penn State University this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
