## LEBANON HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® OHIO SOFTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-7 senior right-handed pitcher and second baseman led the Warriors to a 32-0 record and the Division I semifinals, scheduled for June 5. Trainer posted a 17-0 record, a 0.25 ERA with 233 strikeouts in 173 innings pitched through 32 games. A 2014 First Team All-State selection, she also batted .439 with four home runs, 36 RBI, and a .707 slugging percentage while leading her team to the No. 6 ranking the USA TODAY Super 25 Expert Rankings.

Trainer has maintained a 3.77 GPA in the classroom. A member of the National Honor Society, she has volunteered locally on behalf of Interfaith Hospitality and also through the Anthony Munoz Foundation as a peer tutor.

"Tara Trainer is a player that others look up to," said Tiffany Smith, head coach at Fairborn High. "As a coach, you hate to face someone that strong but love it at the same time. She is a well-rounded pitcher and player. She is someone that many young athletes admire too because of her great attitude and the effort that she puts forth. You can tell every game that she loves what she does."

Trainer has signed a National Letter of Intent to play softball on scholarship at Indiana University this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
