TUALATIN HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® OREGON SOFTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-8 senior right-handed pitcher had led the Timberwolves to a 26-1 record and a berth in the Class 6A state semifinals at the time of her selection. Sorem had posted a 25-0 record with a 0.36 ERA and 313 strikeouts in 154.1 innings pitched thru 27 games. A 2014 Class 6A Second Team All-State honoree, she had thrown five no-hitters and held opponents to a .091 batting average.

Sorem has maintained a 3.52 GPA in the classroom. The Product Line Manager at the Tualatin High Student Store, she has volunteered locally as a tutor for special education students and as a youth softball coach.

"Emily Sorem is incredible," said Jacy Jukkala, head coach of Glencoe High. "She's a tough player who stays incredibly calm even in difficult situations. There is not a pitcher in the state who competes at the level that Emily does."

Sorem will attend Lehigh University in Pennsylvania, where she will play softball beginning this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
