NORTH KINGSTOWN HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® RHODE ISLAND SOFTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (June 4, 2015) — In its 30th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Rachel Kantor of North Kingstown High School as its 2014-15 Gatorade Rhode Island Softball Player of the Year. Kantor is the first Gatorade Rhode Island Softball Player of the Year to be chosen from North Kingstown High School.

The 5-foot-10 senior right-handed pitcher and infielder had led the Skippers to an 18-1 record and a berth in the Division I state tournament at the time of her selection. Kantor had posted a 16-1 record with a 0.71 ERA thru 19 games. She had struck out 95 batters in 69 innings pitched, allowing just 38 hits and 11 walks. A 2014 Providence Journal First Team All-State honoree, she was batting .367 with two home runs and a .533 slugging percentage.

Kantor has maintained a weighted 3.92 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally at the NK5K road race and as a youth softball coach.

"Rachel is without a doubt the key to her team's success," said Stefanie Bello, head coach of La Salle Academy. "She has the ability to not just throw strikes but she controls the batters with her movement and pitch location. She makes the batters over-think what pitch is coming next."

Kantor will attend Wesleyan University, where she will play softball beginning this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
