## BUFFALO HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® WEST VIRGINIA SOFTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-8 senior right-hander led the Bison (32-6) to the Class A state championship this past season. Burdette posted a 25-1 record and a 0.34 ERA in the circle, along with a .674 batting average, 10 home runs and 50 RBI at the plate. The Kanawha Valley Player of the Year, she struck out 253 batters in 161 innings against just 15 walks. Burdette is a four-time member of the Class A All-State Tournament Team and was co-captain of the Class A All-State Team as a junior.

Burdette has maintained a 3.66 GPA in the classroom. A devoted member of her church community, she has served in the student council and has volunteered locally on behalf of food donation drives, the American Red Cross and Operation Christmas Child.

"Burdette is a terrific pitcher and a phenomenal hitter," said Kevin Corbett, head coach at Charleston Catholic High.
"She stands out far and above anyone else we saw all year."

Burdette has signed a National Letter of Intent to play softball on scholarship at Marshall University this fall.
