## IPSWICH HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE SOUTH DAKOTA GIRLS TRACK & FIELD ATHLETE OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (June 17, 2015) — In its 30<sup>th</sup> year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Macy Heinz of Ipswich High School as its 2014-15 Gatorade South Dakota Girls Track & Field Athlete of the Year. The 5-foot-11 sophomore sprinter and distance runner captured four individual state championships at the Class B state meet this spring, leading the Tigers to the state title as a team. Heinz won the 200-meter dash with a time of 25.10 seconds, the 400 in 57.87, the 800 in 2:15.11 and the 1600 with a time of 5:18.02. The 2015 Class B Girls Track Athlete of the Year, she broke the tape in the 800 at the Howard Wood Dakota Relays, crossing the line in 2:11.19.

Heinz has maintained a 4.10 weighted GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally on behalf of the Holy Cross Catholic Church and as a youth softball, tee-ball and track & field coach.

"Macy Heinz has tremendous ability as a track & field athlete," said Jeremy Chicoine, head coach at Sully Buttes High.
"Her accomplishments are only out done by her work ethic and class. As a sophomore, she is already one of the most accomplished track athletes in state history but is extraordinarily humble and gracious, considering all she has done."

Heinz will begin her junior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
