BLOOMINGTON HIGH SCHOOL SOUTH STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE INDIANA BOYS TRACK & FIELD ATHLETE OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (June 19, 2015) — In its 30th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Deakin Volz of Bloomington High School South as its 2014-15 Gatorade Indiana Boys Track & Field Athlete of the Year. Volz is the first Gatorade Indiana Boys Track & Field Athlete of the Year to be chosen from Bloomington High School South.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the track, distinguishes Volz as Indiana's best high school boys track & field athlete. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Boys Track & Field Athlete of the Year award to be announced in June, Volz joins an elite alumni association of state award-winners in 12 sports, including Ryan Hall (1999-01, Big Bear HS, Calif.), Meb Keflezighi (1993-94, San Diego HS, Calif.), Derek Jeter (1991-92, Kalamazoo HS, Mich.), Candace Parker (2001-02, Naperville Central HS, Ill.), Mark Sanchez (2004-05, Mission Viejo HS, Calif.) and Lolo Jones (1997-98, Roosevelt HS, Ia.).

The 5-foot-11, 165-pound senior broke his own meet record with a clearance of 17 feet, 6 inches to claim the state championship in the pole vault this spring. The state's returning Gatorade Boys Track and Field Athlete of the Year, Volz extended his own overall state record when he successfully cleared 17-8, which ranked as the nation's No. 1 performance among prep competitors in 2015 at the time of his selection. He also won the pole vault at this past winter's New Balance Nationals Indoor, setting a U.S. prep indoor record of 17-11.25.

Volz has maintained a 3.80 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally on behalf of a food bank, toy collection drives and his church's religious education program.

"Deakin continues to improve as a national vaulter," said Bloomington South coach Larry Williams. "There were very few meets this year where he didn't vault 17 feet, and those were meets where we had him shut it down because of poor pit conditions for a vaulter of his skill."

Volz has signed a National Letter of Intent to compete in track and field on scholarship at Virginia Tech this fall.

The <u>Gatorade Player of the Year</u> program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with <u>USA TODAY High School Sports</u>, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Two-time winner Volz joins Gatorade Indiana Boys Track & Field Athletes of the Year Codie Hamsley (2012-13, Floyd Central High School), Futsum Zeinasellassie (2011-12, North Central High School), Austin Mudd (2010-11 & 2009-10, Center Grove High School), Corey Shank (2008-09, Northrop), Kevin Schipper (2007-08, Bishop Dwenger), and Benjamin Roy (2006-07, Union County) among the state's list of former award winners.
