PAPILLION-LA VISTA HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE NEBRASKA BOYS TRACK & FIELD ATHLETE OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (June 19, 2015) — In its 30th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced K.J. Cotton of Papillion-La Vista High School as its 2014-15 Gatorade Nebraska Boys Track & Field Athlete of the Year. Cotton is the second Gatorade Nebraska Boys Track & Field Athlete of the Year to be chosen from Papillion-La Vista High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the track, distinguishes Cotton as Nebraska's best high school boys track & field athlete. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Boys Track & Field Athlete of the Year award to be announced in June, Cotton joins an elite alumni association of state award-winners in 12 sports, including Ryan Hall (1999-01, Big Bear HS, Calif.), Meb Keflezighi (1993-94, San Diego HS, Calif.), Derek Jeter (1991-92, Kalamazoo HS, Mich.), Candace Parker (2001-02, Naperville Central HS, Ill.), Mark Sanchez (2004-05, Mission Viejo HS, Calif.) and Lolo Jones (1997-98, Roosevelt HS, Ia.).

The 5-foot-10, 170-pound sophomore sprinter captured a pair of individual state championships this spring and led the Monarchs to a seventh-place finish as a team at the Class A state meet. Cotton won the 100-meter dash with a time of 10.57 seconds and the 200-meter dash in 21.61, earning all-class gold with the fastest times across all classifications in those events. A First Team All-State selection, he was unbeaten in the 100 and the 200 this season. His winning effort of 10.55 in the 100 at the Omaha Metro championships is the fifth-fastest clocking in state history.

Cotton has maintained a 3.88 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered on behalf of an area food pantry and an annual school carnival fundraiser in addition to serving as a youth football and track & field coach.

"K.J. Cotton has gifts and talents that make him among the best sophomore sprinters in the nation," said Papillion-La Vista head coach Joe Pilakowski. "What makes him special is that he willing to work as hard as anyone to take those gifts and talents to new heights."

Cotton will begin his junior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
