BUFORD HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® GEORGIA VOLLEYBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

In a 3-2, title-clinching win over St. Pius X Catholic, she collected 20 digs, 13 kills and four service aces.

Curry has maintained a 4.00 GPA in the classroom. A member of the National Honor Society as well as her school's Spanish club and peer leadership team, she has volunteered locally on behalf of Kids & Pros in addition to serving as a youth volleyball instructor.

"Gabby is the type player that gets better and better every time you see her," said Emi Hughes, head coach at rival North Hall. "Her ability to play multiple positions makes her such a versatile player. I am impressed with the leadership she has on the court even though she is not a senior."

Curry has verbally committed to play volleyball on scholarship at the University of Kentucky in the fall of 2017.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
