IOLANI SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® HAWAII VOLLEYBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (December 8, 2015) — In its 31st year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Bailey Choy of Iolani School as its 2015-16 Gatorade Hawaii Volleyball Player of the Year. Choy is the second Gatorade Hawaii Volleyball Player of the Year to be chosen from Iolani School.

The Honolulu Star-Advertiser All-State Player of the Year, Choy was also named the Interscholastic League of Honolulu Player of the Year in her final prep campaign.

Choy has maintained a 3.38 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally as part of a community clean-up initiative at Neal Blaisdell Park in Honolulu and as a youth volleyball coach.

"Bailey Choy is fluid as an athlete and has a very high volleyball IQ, which helps her to excel as a setter," said Iolani head coach Kainoa Obrey. "Her hands are strong and deceptive and she makes good choices to distribute the ball to all hitters. She is a leader on and off the court and she communicates well, pushing herself and her teammates to be better."

Choy has signed a National Letter of Intent to play volleyball on scholarship at the University of Utah in the fall of 2016.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
