IDAHO FALLS HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® IDAHO VOLLEYBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Taylor has maintained a 4.0 GPA in the classroom. A devoted member of her church community, she has volunteered locally on behalf of a food pantry and youth volleyball programs.

"Taylor is so strong and she can really hit a ball," said Meranda Maestas, head coach at Madison High. "I'm not sure I've seen anyone else at a high school age hit the way she does. She's just a great all-around player."

Taylor will begin her senior year of high school next fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
