## ROMEO HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® MICHIGAN VOLLEYBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Milana has maintained a 3.52 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally on behalf of the Macomb County Rotating Emergency Shelter Team (MCREST) and Orchards Children's Services in addition to donating her time as part of multiple community service initiatives in association with her church youth group.

"Gia Milana has brought another level of excitement to volleyball in our area and is a true role model of what a student-athlete should be," said Tracie Ferguson, head coach at Dakota High. "Her presence on the court cannot be ignored. She's an all-around threat and keeps a composed attitude during play. She lets her kills, blocks, digs and aces do all the talking."

Milana has signed a National Letter of Intent to play volleyball on scholarship at the University of Maryland in the fall of 2016

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
