PAPILLION-LA VISTA SOUTH HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® NEBRASKA VOLLEYBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (December 8, 2015) — In its 31st year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Raegan LeGrand of Papillion-La Vista South High School as its 2015-16 Gatorade Nebraska Volleyball Player of the Year. LeGrand is the fifth Gatorade Nebraska Volleyball Player of the Year to be chosen from Papillion-La Vista South High School.

The 5-foot-10 senior outside hitter slammed 485 kills while recording a .426 kill percentage and .311 hitting percentage this past season, leading the Titans (35-7) to the Class A state semifinals. Named the honorary captain of the Lincoln Journal Star's Super-State squad, LeGrand amassed 700 service receptions, 443 digs, 69 assists, 63 blocks and 25 service aces. A member of the 2014 USA Volleyball Beach High Performance A2 Team and 2013 USA Volleyball Girls' Youth A2 Invitational Training Team, she was a freshman on Papillion-La Vista South's 2012 Class A state championship team.

LeGrand has maintained a 4.03 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally as a mentor and tutor for area elementary schoolchildren and with an organization that provides support for low-income families.

"She could walk into any Division I program and have an immediate impact," said William Root, head coach at rival Grand Island. "Besides being athletic and skilled at the game of volleyball, she outworks everybody on her team. She has great leadership skills."

LeGrand has signed a National Letter of Intent to play volleyball on scholarship at the University of Southern California in the fall of 2015.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
