SOUTH IREDELL HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® NORTH CAROLINA VOLLEYBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

A 2015 Under Armour First Team All-American as named by the American Volleyball Coaches Association, she is the nation's No. 6 ranked recruit as rated by PrepVolleyball.com.

Scoles has maintained a 3.73 weighted GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally on behalf of her community's recreation department and as a youth volleyball coach.

"Julia Scoles is the best player I have ever been privileged to coach against," Jason Stephens, head coach at Hickory High. "She is the type of player that changes the game. You have to build your game plan around beating South Iredell beginning with her."

Scoles has signed a National Letter of Intent to play volleyball on scholarship at the University of North Carolina in the fall of 2016.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
