FATHER RYAN HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® TENNESSEE VOLLEYBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Dorrell has maintained a 3.84 GPA in the classroom. A devoted member of her church community, she has volunteered locally on behalf of a soup kitchen and the Special Olympics.

"Dorrell is a very strong hitter and a great player all the way around," said Becky Pendleton, head coach at Houston High. "She's very consistent and makes very few errors. When the pressure was on, she really got it done."

Dorrell has signed a National Letter of Intent to play volleyball on scholarship at the University of Colorado in the fall of 2016.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
