## ANNAPOLIS HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE MARYLAND GIRLS CROSS COUNTRY RUNNER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (January 14, 2016) — In its 31st year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Maria Coffin of Annapolis High School as its 2015-16 Gatorade Maryland Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year. The 5-foot-4 junior raced to the Class 4A individual state championship this past season with a time of 18:25.2. A 2015 Washington Post Fall First Team All-Met selection, Coffin took third place at the Foot Locker Northeast Regional championships, crossing the line in 17:42.7. She also qualified for the national Foot Locker Cross Country Championships where she finished 27th in 18:22.6.

Coffin has maintained a 4.39 weighted GPA in the classroom. A member of her school concert choir, she has volunteered locally on behalf of her church youth group and as a youth track & field coach.

"Maria Coffin has an unwavering focus and dedication to the sport of running," said Annapolis High head coach Paula Carrigan. "Her passion is evident and she is always curious and wants to learn as much as she can to improve and become a stronger runner. With her workouts and racing, she is willing to find her new edge, explore it and push those limits to the maximum."

Coffin will begin her senior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
