GRANDVILLE HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE MICHIGAN GIRLS CROSS COUNTRY RUNNER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (January 14, 2016) — In its 31st year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Madison Troy of Grandville High School as its 2015-16 Gatorade Michigan Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year. Troy is the first Gatorade Michigan Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year to be chosen from Grandville High School.

The 5-foot-3 sophomore raced to the Division 1 individual state championship this past season with a time of 17:28.2. Troy finished seventh nationally at the Foot Locker Cross Country Championships in 17:41.2 and took 12th at the Nike Cross Nationals Final.

Troy has maintained a 3.50 GPA in the classroom. A devoted member of her church community, she has assisted at a food pantry and volunteered working with underprivileged children.

"Madison is as strong physically as she is mentally, which makes her a force to be reckoned with," said Grandville coach Jennifer Callendar. "She seems to be an ordinary teenager, but as soon as she laces up her running shoes, she transforms into a superhuman athlete."

Troy will begin her junior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
