## CORNING-PAINTED POST HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE NEW YORK GIRLS CROSS COUNTRY RUNNER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (January 14, 2016) — In its 31st year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Jessica Lawson of Corning-Painted Post High School as its 2015-16 Gatorade New York Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year. Lawson is the first Gatorade New York Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year to be chosen from Corning-Painted Post High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the racecourse, distinguishes Lawson as New York's best high school girls cross country runner. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year award to be announced in January, Lawson joins an elite alumni association of past state award-winners in 12 sports, including Ryan Hall (1999-00, 2000-01, Big Bear HS, Calif.), Derek Jeter (1991-92, Kalamazoo HS, Mich.), Candace Parker (2001-02, Naperville Central HS, Ill.), Abby Wambach (1997-98, Our Lady of Mercy, N.Y.) and Mark Sanchez (2004-05, Mission Viejo HS, Calif.).

The 5-foot-6 junior raced to the New York Federation Championship this past season with a time of 17:46.8. The state's Gatorade Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year as a freshman, Lawson finished second at the Class A state championships, second at the Foot Locker Northeast Regional championships and took 11th nationally at the Foot Locker Cross Country Championships in 17:49.3. She set course records while winning the Manhattan Invitational and the Section IV championship.

Lawson has maintained an A average in the classroom. An active member of the 4H Club, she has volunteered locally on behalf of a Christmas food basket program for the needy.

"Jessica is a very unique talent with a lot of natural ability," said Corning indoor track coach Andrew Cartwright. "What is great about her is that she enjoys the daily task of training and trying to improve. It's a year-long effort, and six days a week she is making herself better."

Lawson will begin her senior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Lawson joins Gatorade New York Girls Cross Country Runners of the Year Bella Burda (2014-15 & 2012-13, Arlington High School), Jessica Lawson (2013-14, Corning East High School), Jillian Fanning (2011-12, Fayetteville-Manlius High School), Aisling Cuffe (2010-11 & 2009-10, Cornwall Central High School), and Emily Lipari (2008-09 & 2007-08, Roslyn High School) as athletes who have won the cross country award since its inception in 2007.
