## CHAMBERLAIN HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE SOUTH DAKOTA GIRLS CROSS COUNTRY RUNNER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-6 freshman raced to the Class A individual state championship this past season with a time of 18:41.2. A 2015 First Team All-State selection, Byers completed an undefeated season this fall and clocked the fastest all-class time at the state meet.

Byers has maintained a 3.85 GPA in the classroom. An accomplished pianist and a voracious reader, she has volunteered locally as a bible camp leader and served as a photographer on the high school yearbook staff.

"Ella Byers has a year-round drive for excellence," said Chamberlain High head coach Garry Winter. "Winning races and having the kind of success she has enjoyed is a nice confirmation of her efforts."

Byers will begin her sophomore year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
