HOLY NAMES ACADEMYSTANDOUT NAMED GATORADE WASHINGTON GIRLS CROSS COUNTRY RUNNER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-8 junior raced to the Class 3A individual state championship this past season with a time of 17:53.5. Oakes also won the Bellevue Invitational and the Metro League championship and finished 20th nationally at the Foot Locker Cross Country Championships.

Oakes has maintained a 4.17 GPA in the classroom. Vice president of the Seattle chapter of Jack and Jill of America, Oakes has volunteered locally on behalf of the Woodland Park Zoo and the U.S. Youth Soccer TOPSoccer program serving young athletes with disabilities.

"Jordan has consistently improved in both time and competitiveness each season," said Holy Names coach Erin McCormick. "She constantly elevates the team's energy and morale through her positivity, humor and creativity."

Oakes will begin her senior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
