## WEST SALEM HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE OREGON BOYS CROSS COUNTRY RUNNER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (January 22, 2016) — In its 31st year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Ahmed Muhumed of West Salem High School as its 2015-16 Gatorade Oregon Boys Cross Country Runner of the Year. The 5-foot-9, 120-pound junior raced to the Class 6A individual state championship this past season with a time of 15:38. Muhumed also won The Invitational, the Northwest Classic, the Saxon Invitational and the Sandelie Classic. He took fourth at the Nike Cross Nationals Northwest Regional championships and finished 40th at the NXN Final.

Muhumed has maintained a 3.72 GPA in the classroom. A devoted member of his church community, he has served as a mentor with the African Youth Community Outreach program.

"Ahmed is pretty amazing," said West Salem coach Tom Jimenez. "As gifted as he is as a runner, he's an even better person. He's selfless and his primary goal is to help his teammates become better runners."

Muhumed will begin his senior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
