APPOQUINIMINK HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE DELAWARE BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 6-foot-1, 165-pound senior midfielder and defender scored nine goals and passed for three assists this past season, leading the Jaguars (15-2) to the Division I state semifinals. Dina is the Delaware Boys High School Soccer Coaches Association's State Player of the Year, and was an All-American selection by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America.

Dina has maintained a weighted 3.98 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally at an animal shelter and as a youth soccer coach in addition to donating his time to multiple community-service initiatives through his church youth group.

"Matt Dina has all of the physical attributes you love to see in a soccer player: good size, strength, speed and athleticism," said Justin Null, head coach of St. Georges Tech. "He's also extremely skilled in both tactical ability and technical skill. He sees the field and reads the game extremely well and is extremely impactful while on the field." Dina is undecided upon a collegiate destination.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
