CHRISTIAN BROTHERS COLLEGE HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE MISSOURI BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-11, 160-pound senior defender scored nine goals and passed for four assists this past season, leading the Cadets (23-5-1) to the Class 4, District 4 Tournament final. The National Soccer Coaches Association of America's 2015 High School National Player of the Year, Palazzolo was a member of the U.S. Soccer Under-17 Men's National Team in 2014. Rated as the No. 46 recruit in the Class of 2016 by College Soccer News, he participated in December's High School All-American Game in North Carolina.

Palazzolo has maintained a 3.56 GPA in the classroom. A volunteer at a home for abused children and teenagers, he has donated his time as a CBC ambassador and as a soccer coach for special-needs children.

"AJ Palazzolo is a cut above the rest," said Greg Koeller, head coach of St. Dominic High. "He's a game-changer with versatile ability, great tactical insight and sublime technique. A true soccer personality!"

Palazzolo has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on an athletic scholarship at Indiana University beginning this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
