## BISMARCK HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE NORTH DAKOTA BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-10, 150-pound senior defender scored five goals and passed for three assists this past season, leading the Demons (14-5-1) to the state championship. Nybo was named the Western Dakota Association Outstanding Senior Athlete. A First Team All-State honoree, he was also selected to the All-State Tournament team.

Nybo has maintained a 3.44 GPA in the classroom. Also a hockey standout, he has volunteered locally on behalf of youth sports programs.

"Nybo is a complete soccer player," said Tom Marcis, head coach at Legacy High. "He's got speed and quickness, and his soccer IQ is very high."

Nybo will attend the University of Jamestown this fall, where he will play soccer.
