ABERDEEN CENTRAL HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE SOUTH DAKOTA BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-6, 135-pound junior midfielder scored 10 goals and passed for three assists this past season, leading the Golden Eagles (12-3) to the Class AA state championship game. A transfer from T.F. Riggs High, Hluchy was the Soccer605.com Class AA Player of the Year, and he has been an invitee with the U.S. Youth Soccer Region II Olympic Development Program.

Hluchy has maintained a 3.47 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally with the Feeding America BackPack Program, which provides nutritious meals for children, and as a youth soccer coach and referee. He has also donated his time as part of multiple community-service initiatives through his church youth group.

"Marcus Hluchy works very hard on both sides of the ball and is very technical," said Chris Limmer, head coach of Brandon Valley High. "He also reads the game very well and is a great distributor of the ball."

Hluchy will begin his senior year of high school this fall.
