## RICE MEMORIAL HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE VERMONT BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 6-foot-1, 180-pound senior goalkeeper recorded seven shutouts this past season, leading the Green Knights (16-2) to the Division 1 state championship. An All-American selection by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America, Gazo was also named the Burlington Free Press Player of the Year and the Lake Division Player of the Year.

Gazo has maintained a B average in the classroom. He has volunteered locally on behalf of a retirement home, youth soccer teams and the U.S. Youth Soccer TOPSoccer program serving young athletes with disabilities.

"Gazo commands the box very well and he's strong in the air," said Reeves Livesay, head coach at Middlebury High.
"He's confident, understands the game and he's a vocal leader on the field. He was, by far, the best goalie we faced all year."

Gazo remains undecided upon a collegiate destination.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
