## SOUTH MOUNTAIN HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® ARIZONA GIRLS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

A First Team All-Arizona honoree as a junior, she was also named First Team All-Conference each of the last two seasons.

Pack has maintained a 3.36 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally on behalf of youth sports programs and a dog park.

"Pack is a really smooth operator and she's super hard to defend," said Nikki Simpson, head coach at Ironwood Ridge High. "She can really, really shoot the ball, but she's also crafty getting to the rim."

Pack has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball on scholarship at New Mexico State University this fall.
