The 5-foot-6 junior point guard has led the Eagles to a 31-0 record as they await a possible at-large bid to the Dick's Sporting Goods High School National Tournament, scheduled to begin April 1. Gray has averaged 18.1 points, 4.2 assists, 2.9 rebounds and 2.6 steals through 31 games. Named the Most Outstanding Player at the 2016 Rose Classic Super Jam, she was also MVP of the Nike Under-15 National Championships in 2015 and is rated as the nation's No. 12 recruit in the Class of 2017 by Blue Star Basketball.

Gray, who attends SHABACH! Christian Academy Homeschool, has maintained a B average in the classroom. She has volunteered locally as a lunch monitor at National Christian, and she has donated her time as part of multiple community-service initiatives through her church.

"Mykea is very dangerous with the ball," said Keisha Hunt, head coach of Hamilton Heights (Tenn.) Christian Academy. "She has a big impact on her team's success. Without her, they would not even be close to the team they are with her."

Gray will begin her senior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
