NEW HAMPTON SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® NEW HAMPSHIRE GIRLS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 6-foot junior guard and forward averaged 15.2 points, 10.5 rebounds, 2.0 assists, 1.9 steals and 1.3 blocks per game this season, leading the Huskies (21-7) to the New England Prep School Athletic Council Class A Tournament semifinals. Because of injuries to her teammates, Ripley played all five positions this season for New Hampton. She is a two-time Lakes Region All-Star and a 2014 NEPSAC All-Star.

Ripley has maintained a 3.13 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally as a school ambassador and as part of multiple community service projects through her school.

"Becca Ripley is the most versatile player that I have ever coached against," said Billy O'Dwyer, head coach of Thayer (Mass.) Academy. "She can shoot from all over the court and is strong enough to play in the post. She is too big and strong for most guards and too agile for most post players."

Ripley has made a verbal commitment to play basketball on scholarship at the University of Miami (Fla.) in the fall of 2017.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
