CHAMPLAIN VALLEY UNION HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® VERMONT GIRLS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-8 senior guard had led the Redhawks to a 23-0 record and a berth in the Division 1 state championship game at the time of her selection. Otley averaged 11.8 points, 4.7 assists, 3.5 rebounds and 3.2 steals through 23 games. A First Team All-Metro selection and a First Team Burlington Free Press All-State honoree, she is also a two-time member of the Vermont Basketball Coaches Association Dream Dozen.

Otley has maintained a 3.93 GPA in the classroom. Chairman of her school's Athletic Leadership Council, she has volunteered locally on behalf of the Salvation Army, youth basketball programs and the Environmental Action Club.

"Otley sees the floor so well and she can hurt you in so many ways," said Josh Safran, head coach at Burlington High. "Defensively she's excellent, she can just shut you down."

Otley will attend Tufts University this fall, where she will play basketball.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
