BARROW HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® ALASKA BOYS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (March 17, 2016) — In its 31st year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Kamaka Hepa of Barrow High School as its 2015-16 Gatorade Alaska Boys Basketball Player of the Year. Hepa is the first Gatorade Alaska Boys Basketball Player of the Year to be chosen from Barrow High School.

The 6-foot-9, 210-pound sophomore forward had led the Whalers to a 22-4 record and a berth in the Class 3A state quarterfinals at the time of his selection. The state's returning Gatorade Boys Basketball Player of the Year, Hepa is averaging 19.2 points, 11.8 rebounds, 3.2 blocks and 2.8 assists per game. He was a First Team All-State honoree and was selected to the USA TODAY American Family Insurance ALL-USA Alaska First Team as a freshman.

Hepa has maintained a 4.0 GPA in the classroom. A devoted member of his church youth group, he has volunteered locally on behalf of youth basketball programs.

"Hepa impacts the game in so many ways, and he's a great team guy," said Frank Ostanik, head coach at Monroe Catholic High. "You have to guard him out to the 3-point line, and if you double him, he has extraordinary vision and easily finds his teammates. I rarely ever see him take a bad shot."

Hepa will begin his junior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
