BENTONVILLE HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® ARKANSAS BOYS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 6-foot-4, 190-pound senior guard led the Tigers to a 21-9 record and the Class 7A state championship game this past season. Monk averaged 28.6 points, 7.5 rebounds and 4.4 assists per game. The USA TODAY American Family Insurance ALL-USA Arkansas Player of the Year as a junior, he has been selected to play in the Jordan Brand Classic and the McDonald's All-American games. Monk is also a First Team All-Arkansas honoree and was named a Second Team Naismith Trophy All-American.

Monk has maintained a B average in the classroom. A member of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, he has volunteered locally serving Thanksgiving meals to the needy and assisting at youth basketball camps.

"Monk does spectacular things on a basketball court," said Jeremy Price, head coach at Springdale High. "He's got NBA level athleticism and he has a great ability to create his own shot. He can elevate and shoot from anywhere on the floor and all you can do is hope that he misses."

Monk has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball on scholarship at the University of Kentucky this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
