## UNIVERSITY OF DETROIT JESUIT HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® MICHIGAN BOYS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Winston averaged 23.6 points, 6.7 assists and 5.2 rebounds per game while shooting 87 percent from the free throw line through 24 games. A 2016 Michigan Mr. Basketball finalist and a 2016 Jordan Brand Classic game invitee, he has helped University of Detroit Jesuit to a No. 6 ranking in the USA TODAY Super 25 Expert Rankings.

Winston has maintained a 3.56 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally on behalf of a soup kitchen and as a peer mentor and in association with the Black Awareness Society for Education.

"Cassius Winston has revitalized our basketball program," said University of Detroit Jesuit High head coach Patrick Donnelly. "He is a tireless worker that is constantly looking to perfect his craft. His leadership skills are second to none."

Winston has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball on scholarship at Michigan State University this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
