Battle averaged 19.1 points, 9.1 rebounds, 5.1 assists and 2.7 steals per game. A former member of the USA Basketball U17 National Team, he was the Somerset County Player of the Year and a Second Team All-State selection as a sophomore.

Battle has maintained a 3.11 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally on behalf of the New Beginnings school for autistic children.

"Battle can do pretty much anything on a basketball court," said Edwin Santana, head coach at Perth Amboy High.
"He's athletic, strong, a great defender. He can score, he can rebound. He can jump through the building and he's a really good passer too."

Battle has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball on scholarship at Syracuse University this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
