RIO RANCHO HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® NEW MEXICO BOYS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (March 17, 2016) — In its 31st year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Clay Patterson of Rio Rancho High School as its 2015-16 Gatorade New Mexico Boys Basketball Player of the Year. The 6-foot, 160-pound junior guard led the Rams to a 19-12 record and the Class 6A state title this past season. Patterson averaged 20.5 points, 3.3 assists and 2.3 rebounds per game while shooting 55 percent from 3-point range. A First Team All-State selection, he scored a game-high 17 points in Rio Rancho's 56-54 win over Carlsbad in the Class 6A state championship game.

Patterson has maintained a 3.59 GPA in the classroom. A devoted parishioner in his church community, he has volunteered locally as a youth basketball coach, on behalf of an area retirement home and in association with an elementary school literacy-outreach initiative.

"Clay Patterson has evolved into a fantastic basketball player in just one year," said Rio Rancho High head coach Wally Salata. "He practices as hard as he plays and he is very consistent on a nightly basis. His future is very bright."

Patterson will begin his senior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
