CYPRESS LAKES HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® TEXAS BOYS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 6-foot-4, 165-pound senior guard averaged 32.4 points, 7.7 rebounds, 4.2 assists, 2.7 steals and 1.6 blocks per game this past season, leading the Spartans (25-8) to the Class 6A, Region 3 championship game. A finalist for the Naismith Trophy Boys Basketball Player of the Year, Fox was selected to participate in both the McDonald's All-American Game and the Jordan Brand Classic. He concluded his prep basketball career with 3,113 points.

Fox has maintained a B average in the classroom. He has volunteered locally on a fundraising campaign to benefit breast cancer research and as an elementary school mentor and motivational speaker.

"De'Aaron is as complete a player as I've ever coached against," said Chris Draudt, head coach of Cypress Woods High.
"He scored when he needed to in order to help his team win, but he spent a lot of his time working hard to get his teammates involved in every way possible."

Fox has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball on scholarship at the University of Kentucky this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
