PAUL VI CATHOLIC HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® VIRGINIA BOYS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

A First Team All-Washington Catholic Athletic Conference honoree, King was selected to participate in the McDonald's All-American Game and the Jordan Brand Classic. He is ranked as the No. 21 recruit in the Class of 2016 by Scout.com.

King has maintained a 3.54 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally as a youth mentor and youth basketball coach, and has also donated his time with the Special Olympics and special-needs students at his school.

"V.J. King is a terrific player, he has a chance to be a pro," said Neil Berkman, head coach of Bishop Ireton High. "He was Paul VI's entire team. It seemed like he took 60 percent of their shots."

King has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball on scholarship at the University of Louisville this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
