OAK MOUNTAIN HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE ALABAMA GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-7 sophomore midfielder scored 18 goals and passed for 17 assists this past season, leading the Eagles (23-4-1) to the second round of the Class 7A state tournament. A three-time Birmingham All-Metro Team selection, Pack was a 2015 AL.com Super All-State honoree. She concluded her sophomore year with 46 goals and 37 assists in her prep soccer career.

Pack has maintained a weighted 4.31 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally on behalf of multiple fundraising campaigns to benefit cancer research and as a youth soccer coach. She has also donated her time to the Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources.

"Julia Pack elevates the play of her teammates from average to great," said Will Patridge, head coach of Hoover High. "Against Oak Mountain, you have to know where Julia is at all times. She is a talented player with a high soccer IQ that can adapt her playing style on the fly to give teams fits."

Pack has made a verbal commitment to play soccer on an athletic scholarship at Auburn University beginning in the fall of 2018.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
