## INDIAN RIVER HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE DELAWARE GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Beam has maintained a 4.52 GPA in the classroom. Also a talented artist and a member of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, she has volunteered locally on behalf of a community kitchen and the U.S. Youth Soccer TOPSoccer program serving young athletes with disabilities.

"Beam doesn't just impact the game, she controls the game," said Chase Humphrey, head coach at Delmar High. "She sees the field well, she can distribute, she can take on defenders and she can find the back of the net with ease."

Beam has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on scholarship at the University of Richmond this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
