ST. THOMAS AQUINAS HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE FLORIDA GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-6 junior forward scored 37 goals and passed for 23 assists this past season, leading the Raiders (22-1-1) to the Class 4A state semifinals. A two-time All-Broward County Player of the Year, Dorosy was a 2015-16 Class 4A First Team All-State selection. She concluded her junior year with 84 goals and 47 assists in her prep soccer career.

Dorosy has maintained a weighted 3.83 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally as part of community-beautification projects and as a youth soccer coach.

"Bella Dorosy is just a different kind of player," said David Seevers, head coach of Pace High. "She has all the elements of a great player, and she knows when and how to use those abilities to greatest effect. My defenders simply didn't have an answer for her."

Dorosy has made a verbal commitment to play soccer on an athletic scholarship at Florida State University beginning in the fall of 2017.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
