HOUGH HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE NORTH CAROLINA GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (May 17, 2016) — In its 31st year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Ashlynn Serepca of Hough High School as its 2015-16 Gatorade North Carolina Girls Soccer Player of the Year. The 5-foot-6 sophomore forward has led the Huskies to a 16-4-1 record and a berth in the third round of the Class 4A state tournament against Providence High, scheduled for May 18. Serepca has scored 33 goals and passed for 14 assists. A member of the U.S. Soccer Under-16 Girls National Team player pool, Serepca was a 2015 First Team All-State selection. She enters the Providence game with 57 goals and 26 assists in her prep soccer career.

Serepca has maintained a weighted 4.45 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally as a youth soccer coach and as part of multiple community service initiatives through her church youth group.

"Ashlynn Serepca is certainly the real deal," said Mike Kutcher, head coach of North Mecklenburg High. "She is by far, in my opinion, the best player in the state. She is skilled and very strong on the ball. Simply put, she can just take over games."

Serepca has made a verbal commitment to play soccer on an athletic scholarship at the University of Virginia beginning in the fall of 2018.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
