## UNION HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE OKLAHOMA GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-8 junior forward scored 10 goals and passed for eight assists this past season, leading the Redskins to a 19-0 record and the Class 6A state championship. An All-American selection by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America, Goins is a member of the U.S. Under-18 Women's National Team and was a First Team All-Metro honoree as a sophomore. She recorded two goals and one assist in the state championship game against Owasso, capping a second consecutive unbeaten season for Union.

Goins has maintained a 4.0 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally on behalf of youth soccer programs and summer camps.

"She has a tremendous ability to finish, even under pressure, and her understanding and vision of the game is pretty amazing," said Troy Tokarchik, head coach at Bishop Kelley High. "She always finds a way to get involved and she does things you don't expect."

Goins will begin her senior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
