MID-PACIFIC INSTITUTE HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® HAWAII BASEBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (May 24, 2016) — In its 31st year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Alex Oley of Mid-Pacific Institute as its 2015-16 Gatorade Hawaii Baseball Player of the Year. Oley is the nineth Gatorade Hawaii Baseball Player of the Year to be chosen from Mid-Pacific Institute.

The 5-foot-9, 160-pound senior outfielder and left-handed pitcher batted .406 with 16 runs scored and a .638 slugging percentage, leading the Owls (18-5) to the Division I quarterfinals this past season. The 2016 Interscholastic League of Honolulu Player of the Year, Oley also posted a 5-1 record on the mound with a 2.35 ERA.

Oley has maintained a 3.49 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally on behalf of the Special Olympics and as a youth baseball coach.

"Alex Oley exemplifies everything we hope youth players to be," said Keenan Sue, head coach at the Punahou School. "He is hard working and has a positive attitude but is a fierce competitor who rises to a challenge. He is genuinely confident, yet humble and just a plain, good player."

Oley has signed a National Letter of Intent to play baseball on scholarship at New Mexico State University this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
