PELLA HIGH SCHOOL HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® IOWA BASEBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (May 24, 2016) — In its 31st year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Grant Judkins of Pella High School as its 2015-16 Gatorade Iowa Baseball Player of the Year. Judkins is the first Gatorade Iowa Baseball Player of the Year to be chosen from Pella High School.

The 6-foot-3, 192-pound senior right-handed pitcher and infielder posted an 11-1 record with a 0.56 ERA and 112 strikeouts in 74.2 innings, leading the Dutch (34-5) to the Class 3A semifinals this past season. A 2015 First Team All-State selection, Judkins also batted .520 with 13 home runs, 57 RBI and 51 runs scored.

Judkins has maintained a 3.95 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally with the Salvation Army in addition to donating his time assisting the elderly and on behalf of his church youth group.

"Grant Judkins has worked hard to make himself a standout in the state of Iowa," said Chris Coffman, head coach at Grinnell High. "As a competitor, he is respectful and showed good sportsmanship every time we have played him."

Judkins has signed a National Letter of Intent to play baseball on scholarship at the University of Iowa this fall.

Iowa-distinct from the other 46 states sanctioning baseball-begins its high school season in conjunction with Memorial Day, which results in the annual Gatorade honor being based upon candidates' previous scholastic season and offseason club/showcase performance, if applicable.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
