A 2015 First Team All-State selection, Garley compiled a 7-1 record on the mound along with a 1.45 ERA and 70 strikeouts in 58 innings pitched.

Garley has maintained a 3.83 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally on behalf of the Young Life Christian ministries and as a youth baseball coach.

"Nathaniel Garley truly fits the mold of a student-athlete," said Eldorado head coach Jim Johns. "He is truly a breath of fresh air in a society that values athletic success, but seems to accept unsportsmanlike conduct as a byproduct. He has respect for everyone involved in the game and he has fun playing it."

Garley has signed a National Letter of Intent to play baseball on scholarship the University of New Mexico this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
