## LAURENS DISTRICT HIGH SCHOOL HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® SOUTH CAROLINA BASEBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (May 24, 2016) — In its 31st year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Thomas Jones of Laurens District High School as its 2015-16 Gatorade South Carolina Baseball Player of the Year. Jones is the second Gatorade South Carolina Baseball Player of the Year to be chosen from Laurens District High School.

The 6-foot-3, 205-pound senior centerfielder batted .420 with five home runs, 19 RBI and 38 runs scored, leading the Raiders (18-11) to the Class 4A district championship game this past season. A 2015 Under Armour All-American, Jones compiled a .716 slugging percentage and stole 16 bases in 17 attempts.

Jones has maintained a 3.66 GPA in the classroom. A member of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, he has volunteered locally on behalf of an elementary school literacy-outreach program and participated in Palmetto Boys State, an American Legion program providing students with an opportunity to experience the workings of government.

"Thomas Jones is hands down the most talented player we have competed against this year," says Stanley Moss, Emerald High head coach. "He is a five-tool player and what makes him special is how he approaches the game. He is very mature for his age and plays the game with passion, but very under control."

Jones has signed a National Letter of Intent to play baseball on scholarship at Vanderbilt University this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
