The 6-foot-2, 195-pound senior outfielder and first baseman batted .446 with five home runs and 23 RBI this past season, leading the Eagles (20-5) to the first round of the Class 4A regional tournament. A 2015 Under Armour All-American, Jones also scored 27 runs and compiled a .500 on-base percentage.

Jones has maintained a 3.76 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally as a peer mentor and as a youth baseball coach.

"Jones is a very talented player," said Brett Jaime, head coach at Kentlake High. "His attitude and sportsmanship was always good and he is definitely a great baseball player."

Jones has signed a National Letter of Intent to play baseball on scholarship at the University of Washington this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
